CAMPUS ARRANGEMENTS DURING ALERT LEVEL 2

In a survey that was conducted last week among students who have returned to campus at the start of Term 3, students reported that they felt safe and socially properly distanced, and that they experienced the screening procedure as sufficient and thorough. We are very satisfied with this feedback.

Since Monday, a further batch of students returned to campus for in-person classes. We rely on everyone to comply with all the safety measures at campus to help keep us all safe. Campus arrangements

- The campus will be open between 09:00 and 16:00.
- The only access to the campus is at the main entrance on Level 1, where Thandi will check your screening form and take your temperature before allowing you access to the building.
- Students who wish to work at campus are welcome to use available venues.
- A maximum of 4 students will be allowed per studio at the same time (including the auditorium and CA studio).
- Contemporary Art students will only be allowed to work in Studio CA 1 (ground floor of the Silo building) and must book a slot beforehand. They must also first report to Thandi before they will be allowed access to the studio.
- Library access is still restricted and students are not allowed to browse books. Should you wish to loan a book, please follow the Library protocol. The Library Assistant, Jozua Serfontein, will be at the Library on Wednesdays between 09:00 and 14:30, as from 1 September.
- Students will be allowed to work at campus after hours at their own responsibility, but must apply for after-hour access as usual. Thandi will manage the requests for after-hour work and disable the alarm. [[After-hours' access request form](#)]
- All students must complete the [COVID-19 Campus Screening Questionnaire](#) before coming to campus, during as well as after hours.
- Students must adhere to all Covid-19 Campus protocols and make regular use of the sanitisers provided.

Loadshedding

Since loadshedding is again part of our lives, the Creative Academy has implemented the following measures to deal with this problem at campus.

- A UPS supports the Server at campus during loadshedding. The server and WiFi will be functional for 2+ hours after a power-cut. A fail-over LTE solution will provide students with data, even though not at the same speed we are used to.
- Make sure your laptop is fully charged before loadshedding and going to campus. The portable inverter available at campus can only carry a restricted number of computers during loadshedding.
- Computers and laptops must be connected directly to the inverter during loadshedding.
- Printing is not possible during loadshedding.

We wish to reiterate that students who prefer not to return for in-person classes will not be penalised in any way. We will continue to accommodate and support them online for the remainder of the year.
